Private and Public Sector Convene for  
Third "Pipeline Crisis/Winning Strategies" Forum July 11, 2008 in New York City

New York, N.Y., July 8, 2008 – The Pipeline Crisis/Winning Strategies Initiative will convene leaders from the legal, financial, human services, and academic communities for its third plenary forum to focus on solving one of America's most gripping social problems – the widening social and economic divide between young black men and the rest of society.

Senator Charles Schumer and Congressman Charles Rangel will each engage in a dialogue with Harvard Law Professor Charles J. Ogletree, Jr. Professor Ogletree will also moderate a distinguished panel of scholars, practitioners, government officials and community leaders (see attached agenda).

The panel will discuss the Initiative's 2008 National Platform, a wide-reaching statement of policy and program reforms to address the panoply of obstacles to young black men's pathways to success, as well as realistic and practical strategies to remove the social and economic barriers that limit the number of young black men in the pipeline to higher education and professional endeavors.

Senator Schumer and Congressman Rangel will discuss America's urban agenda and how the private sector can help bridge the gap between America's global business interests and her disadvantaged youth.

The Initiative also will present awards to honorees who have shown courage, leadership, and innovation in developing and executing winning strategies and advancing important social initiatives targeting or significantly impacting young black men. The honorees are: Bard College President Leon Botstein, for the Bard Prison Initiative, City University of New York Chancellor Matthew Goldstein, for the City University of New York

Black Male Initiative, and Dr. Roland Fryer, for the New York City Million Motivation Campaign.

As in years past, more than 1,000 attendees are expected at the event, including leading lawyers, bankers, judges, business executives, government and public officials, human service professionals, philanthropic leaders and academics.
